Voter Services Are Now Available in Filipino! SF Ballots Are Changing!

The Department of Elections now offers telephone and in-person assistance in Filipino. Within the month, the Department will also offer voter information and materials in Filipino on sfelections.org and in printed format. Beginning with the November 3, 2015, election, there will be three bilingual versions of the ballot: English + Chinese, English + Spanish, and English + Filipino.

Ballots in English and each certified language will be available by mail, at the City Hall Voting Center, and at all polling places. The Department of Elections encourages voters who wish to receive ballots in Chinese, Spanish, or Filipino to provide that information in advance at sfelections.org/language.
